MARATHON HERE SUNDAY

This coming Sunday we are to be invaded by two visiting groups from Marathon. They are sending up a baseball team to take on our local team in the first of a home-and-home series. Game time is set for 2 P.M. Practise sessions are scheduled for tonight and Saturday morning and an invitation is extended to all baseball players to attend.

The other visiting group will be a Tennis team of approximately 10 players who will take on some of the men players from Terrace Bay in a few friendly exhibition matches during Sunday afternoon. This is a return visit for the trip that our **players** made to Marathon last year when they acquitted themselves so nobly.

Both of these events should be well worth watching and warrant your attendance at either or both. Now that the Highway is open, it is hoped that these two will be the forerunners of many friendly visits between the two towns.

SHIFT NO. 1 - SOFTBALL CHAMPS

Flashing the brilliance which gave them first place in the league schedule by a wide margin and which enabled them to route Townsite in two straight semi-final playoff games, the Shift #1 Softball team on Tuesday evening captured the Softball Championship of Terrace Bay. The Salary team bowed out gamely fighting and although they were beaten 12-7 in the final game, they had the bases filled when the final out of the series was made.

After Shift #1 had taken the first game 7-6 in the extra inning, Salary came roaring back last Friday evening to tie the series by virtue of a 7-5 victory. Gord Rowlandson tamed the Shift #1 power gang allowing but 5 hits while his teammates combed the offerings of Frank Whitfield for 11 hits including a home run by Dalzell and 2 doubles by Grishaber. The third game Sunday evening was witnessed by the season's largest crowd and it was a good ball game all the way.
