United States (especially parcels to allow for Customs Examination) Mail before December 18th

British Columbia, Alberta and SaskatchewanMail before December 12th

Newfoundland (for remote points consult the local post office)....Mail before December 12th

Manitoba.....Mail before December 14th

Maritime Provinces.....Mail before December 14th

Ontario and Quebec.....Mail before December 15th
