EYE WITNESS NO. 43 - This is your chance to discover Paris and to see Paris discover Canadian troubador Felix Leclerc. A wandering mistrel of the modern kind, Leclerc sings for a growing audience of night club patrons. The ballads are his. Other items of this film show Ottawa's junior traffic patrol guarding school crossings and the industrious boat builders of Deep Cove, B.C.

VOICES FROM ACADIA - The boy's choir of St. Joseph's University, New Brunswick, sing six songs which show their amazing versatility. Prize winners at the International Eistedfod in Wales, the choristers in this film choose songs of several countries. They sing in English, others in French, and one, a Gregorian chant, in Latin.
