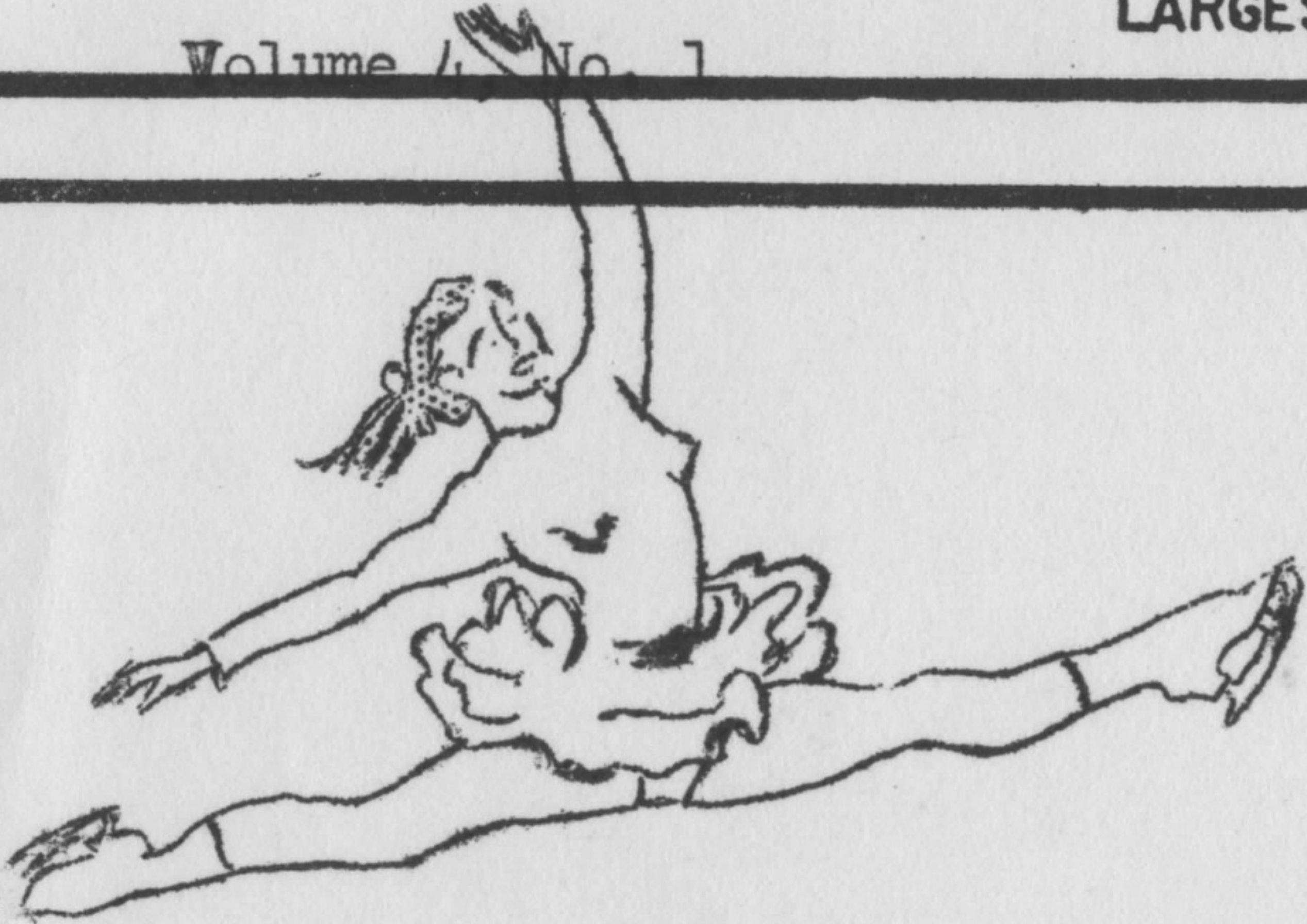


FIGURE SKATING COMMENCES JAN. 7TH
