Blood don rs are rushed from the LongLac Mill to help in the battle.

Mission accomplished. Pilot of the Helicopter to be congratulated on a job well done under very difficult conditions.

The star of the drama, Mrs. Ranta is still in the Terrace Bay Hospital and her condition is reported as good.
