



ONTARIO FISHERY REGULATIONS 1954. FISH

(OPEN SEASON-ANGLING)

(All dates inclusive)

From a summary published by the Ontario Department of Lands and Forests:

**BLACK BASS:** July 1st to October 15th, except (1) St. Clair River, Lake St. Clair and Detroit River: June 25th to December 15th; and (2) Lake Erie and Niagara River between Lake Erie and Niagara Falls: July 1st to December 15th.

**MASKINONGE:** (a) North and west of and including the French and Mattawa Rivers and Lake Nipissing and that part of Georgian Bay north of a line from the northern extremity of Fitzwilliam Island northeasterly to the southeasterly limit of Travers Township: June 20th to October 15th. (b) South of and excluding the French and Mattawa Rivers and Lake Nipissing: July 1st to October 15th; except (1) St. Clair River, Lake St. Clair and Detroit River: June 25th to December 15th; and (2) Lake Erie and Niagara River between Lake Erie and Niagara Falls: July 1st to December 15th.

**SPECKLED TROUT, BROWN TROUT, RAINBOW TROUT, AURORA TROUT AND KAMLOOPS TROUT:** May 1st to September 15th.

**QUANANICHE AND ATLANTIC SALMON:** May 1st to October 15th.

**YELLOW PICKEREL (Dore, Pike-Perch, Walleye Pike) AND PIKE (Great Northern Pike and Grass Pike):** (a) No closed season in Great Lakes, Georgian Bay, North Channel, and their intervening international connecting waters; except (1) Bay of Quinte of Lake Ontario: Pickerel - May 15th to March 31st, next following; Pike - no closed season.

(b) North and west of and excluding the French and Mattawa Rivers and Lake Nipissing (other than "A"): Pickerel - May 22nd to April 14th, next following (except Kenora and Rainy River Districts and boundary waters between Ontario and Minnesota: May 15th to April 14th next following); Pike-

no closed season when taken by angling.

(c) South of and including the French and Mattawa Rivers and Lake Nipissing (other than "a" and "d"): Pickerel - May 15th to December 31st; Pike - May 15th to March 31st next following. (See regulations for exception regarding pike in parts of Essex and Kent Counties.) (d) St. Lawrence River: May 1.-March 31st next following, except (1) Lake St. Francis: Pickerel - May 15th to November 15th; Pike - no closed season.

**LAKE TROUT:** (a) No closed season in Great Lakes, Georgian Bay, North Channel, intervening international connecting waters, and St. Lawrence R.; (b) Districts of Algoma, Cochrane, Manitoulin, Nipissing (North of and including the French and Mattawa Rivers and Lake Nipissing), Sudbury and Timiskaming and boundary waters between Ontario and Minnesota: January 1st to September 24th;

(c) Districts of Kenora, Rainy River, and Thunder Bay (except boundary waters between Ontario and Minnesota, see "b"): No closed season when taken by angling; (d) South of and excluding the French and Mattawa Rivers and Lake Nipissing (other than "a"): November 6th to October 5th, next following except (1) County of Haliburton: May 1st to October 5th.

**WHITEFISH:** (a) No closed season in Great Lakes, North Channel, Georgian Bay and their connecting waters, and St. Lawrence River. (November 1st to October 4th next following: North and west of and including French and Mattawa Rivers and Lake Nipissing see exception (3), except (1) Cochrane and Thunder Bay Districts: October 21st to September 24th next following; (2) Kenora and Rainy River Districts: November 16th to October 24th next following; and (3) Lake Nipissing: November 16th to October 14th next following. (c) November 6th to October 5th next following: South of and excluding French River, Lake Nipissing and Mattawa River. **STURGEON:** (a) No closed season in Great Lakes, Georgian Bay, North Channel, intervening international connecting waters and St. Lawrence R. (b) In all waters other than "a": July 1st to May 31st next following.

**NOTE:** No person shall fish after October 15th in the countries of Durham, Northumberland, Peterborough and Victoria; the Trent River, Lake Scugog and Elrymple or Mud Lake; and Beaver Creek, Crow Lake or Crow River in Hastings County.
