

## RECIPE OF THE WEEK

VEAL SCALOPPINE ON SPAGHETTI

2 pounds boned veal shoulder, sliced thin
1/3 cup all purpose flour
1 teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon pepper
1/3 cup butter or margarine
1 clove garlic, minced
1/2 cup minced onion
1 4-ounce can sliced mushrooms, drained
1 No. 2 can tomatoes
1 teaspoon sugar
8 ounces spaghetti

Have veal flattened for scalapine. Dredge veal in flour combined with salt and pepper. Melt butter or margarine in a skillet over low heat. Add veal; saute until lightly browned; remove veal. Add garlic and onion; cook until onion is tender. Gradually add rest of ingredients except spaghetti; add veal. Cover and cook over low heat 1 hour, or until veal is tender. Serve over spaghetti. Makes 4-6 servings.
