TERRACE BAY COMMUNITY CHEST IS PLANNED

Last Monday night a meeting was held in the Continuation School to consider the formation of a Terrace Bay Community Chest. The Kiwanis Club, who are spearheading this plan invited representatives of all wage-earning groups in Terrace Bay to this meeting.

After discussing two types of plans the group decided that the following plan would be most suitable to cover our needs. An executive would be elected and a constitution written to administer all funds. There would be one appeal for money each year to take care of all appeals, both National, such as the Red Cross, Blind, Children's Aid etc. as well as the local emergency charities. A set sum would be set aside to take care of the local emergency charities. The remaining money would be divided among the designated National Charities. Local emergency appeals would be considered by an investigating committee and if considered for financial help would be subject to a set minimum and maximum amount of money that could be paid to one charitable appeal. All people in the community would be eligible for help from the Community Chest.

The above plan is only suggested, and awaits the approval of the people of Terrace Bay. With this in mind, representatives attending the meeting will discuss the plan with members of their organizations. On Monday, March 29th they will again meet at the Continuation School to consider the next steps in making the Community Chest a reality.
