RECIPE OF THE WEEK

HOT CROSS BUNS (Quick Version)

- 1 1/4 cups sifted bread flour
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon allspice
- 1/2 cup shortening
- 1 cup rolled oats (uncooked quick or old fashioned)
- 1/2 cup raisins
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped citron peel
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped candied cherries
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 2 or 3 tablespoons milk

Have cookie sheet ready, ungreased.

Heat oven to 425 degrees F.

Sift flour, baking powder, salt, sugar and spices into large mixing bowl.

Cut in shortening until mixture resembles coarse meal.

Mix in the rolled oats, raisins, citron and cherries.

Add beaten eggs and milk, stirring lightly and only enough to dampen dry ingredients.

Knead dough gently on floured board a few seconds. Shape into 12 balls and place on ungreased cookie sheet. Flatten balls slightly.

Bake in a hot oven for 12 to 15 minutes or until well browned.

While buns are still hot, make a cross on each with icing sugar frosting.

Chair Into Swing

Instead of discarding the high chair of a baby who has outgrown it, try converting it into an out-of-doors swing.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS (Cont.)

This can be done by removing the legs completely, then attaching firm chains or 1/2-inch cotton rope to the ends of the arms and the two back corners of the chair. If rope is used, be sure it is attached to snug-fitting chains that should encircle the tree limb on which you hang the swings.

The swing will not shift on the limb while the youngster is in it if the chains are securely fastened. You can do this by driving a nail through one link, which should pierce the wood beneath it also. The left front and back rope can be secured to one chain, and the right front and back rope to the other. Don't remove the front bib portion of the chair. Instead, make sure that it locks securely, using a screen eye and hook on one side. If desired, pad the seat, the bottom and the inner sides and back with plastic-covered sponge rubber to make the youngster more comfortable.
