RECIPE OF THE WEEK

BAKED SPANISH RICE WITH CANADIAN BACON

- 1½ cups processed rice
- 1 cup boiling water
- 1¼ cups tomato juice
- 1 5-oz. can tomato sauce
- ½ teaspoon chili powder
- 1 teaspoon garlic salt
- ¼ cup chopped onion
- 2 tablespoons chopped green pepper
- 8 slices Canadian bacon

In 1½-quart casserole combine rice, water, tomato juice, tomato sauce, chili powder, garlic salt, onion and green pepper. Bake, covered, at 375°F. for 1 hour or until rice is fluffy and all liquid absorbed. Remove cover and arrange bacon slices over rice. Continue baking for 10 minutes or until bacon is slightly browned.
