The Spred Satin paints used in the townsite though they dry rapidly do not cure for 28 days and should not be washed before the end of this period. Should the wall become marked before this you should not wash off right away but wait until curing is complete. Then also though these paints wash well do not use strong soaps or detergents. Spic and Span is quite all right if not used in too strong a solution. Stronger soaps can be used on the enamel in Kitchen and Bathrooms. Townsite Department.

## 3RD AND 4TH VICTORY LOAN BONDS HAVE BEEN CALLED FOR PAYMENT

If you hold Third Victory Loan 3% Bonds (issued November, 1942 to mature November 1956) they should be presented for payment on or after June 1st through any branch bank in Canada. After this date no further interest will be paid. The interest coupon dated November 1st, 1954 and all coupons dated later than this must be attached to the bonds when they are presented for payment. Payment will be \$101.26 for a \$100 bond (and for other denominations accordingly). This payment includes a \$1 premium as required by the terms of the bond - plus 26¢ which is interest at 3% from May 1st to June 1stthe period since the last coupon became payable.
