## RECIPE OF THE WEEK SWEETHEART COOKIES

1/3 cup shortening  
 1 cup brown sugar, packed  
 2 eggs, well-beaten  
 1/3 cup milk  
 1 cup seedless raisins  
 2 cups sifted pastry flour  
 2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder  
 1/3 teaspoon salt  
 2/3 teaspoon mace  
 1/3 teaspoon cinnamon  
 1 cup bran flakes  
 Grease baking sheets, Heat oven to  
 375 degrees F.

Blend shortening and sugar. Add beaten eggs, milk and raisins and mix well.

Sift flour with baking powder, salt and spices and add to batter along with bran flakes.

Drop by spoonfuls on greased baking sheet. Bake in moderately hot oven for about 10 minutes.

(Makes about 3 1/2 dozen)
