RECIPE OF THE WEEK CRUNCHY MERINGUES

(8 of 3¼-inch diameter)

- 2 egg whites
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup fine granulated sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/2 teaspoon almond extract
- 3 shredded wheat biscuits

Beat egg whites and salt until they will hold a soft peak. Gradually beat in sugar and flavorings until whites will hold a stiff peak.

Fold in finely crushed shredded wheat.

On lightly greased cookie sheet, make 6 large or 8 medium "nests" of meringue, hollowing out centre with the back of a spoon.

Bake in a slow oven of 275 degrees F. until meringues are firm - about 50 minutes.

Serve with fresh or frozen fruit ladled into centre of meringue.
