JIM TAYLOR SPEAKS TO KIWANIS CLUB

On Tuesday June 8th the Kiwanis had as their speaker Jim Taylor, District Forester of the Geraldton Forestry District which includes Terrace Bay.

Mr. Taylor delivered a most interesting talk on his department's activities. The Geraldton Forestry District for example comprises twelve million acres. The department obtains revenue from timber cut in the District to the amount of 1 million three hundred thousand dollars or roughly ten per cent of the revenue for stumpage fees in the province. Mr. Taylor explained the District ranger set up in this Forestry District which includes the station at Pays Platt. He also stated that fires are the chief enemy of the Rangers, and that 85 per cent of forest fires are caused by carelessness of the general public.

Mr. Taylor stressed the necessity of obtaining Travel Permits to travel in the forests. They are free of charge and may be obtained without any red tape. The permits enable his department to know what people are in the bush and their whereabouts and it is a great aid in the prevention of fires.

Mr. Taylor was heartily thanked for his visit to Terrace Bay and for his address.
