MINING16,049 CLAIMS REGISTERED IN FIRST QUARTER

Prospectors in Ontario have been extremely active so far this year, according to figures recently released by the Ontario Department of Mines. During the first three months of this year, the number of mining claims staked amounted to 16,049 as against 4,261 for the same period in 1953.

The greatest activity has been in the Port Arthur-Kowkash Division which shows 9,442 claims recorded as against 561 for the same period last year. Eastern Ontario had 2,458 while the Sudbury region had 1,775.

Recordings in the other districts were Fort Frances 144; Kenora 76; Larder Lake 227; Montreal River 81; Parry Sound 145; Patricia 241; Porcupine 67; Red Lake 422; Sault Ste. Marie 833; and Temiskaming 138.

Number of licenses issued during the three-month period amounted to 2,855 and the number of licences renewed was 5,419.
