



RECIPE OF THE WEEK
RHUBARB CRISP PUDDING

- 4 1/2 cups rhubarb cut in 1/4 inch pieces
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ginger
- 2 tablespoons water
- 4 tablespoons butter
- 1/3 cup brown sugar, firmly packed
- 1/3 cup Robin Hood Flour
- 3/4 cup Robin Hood Oats

Place rhubarb in greased deep baking dish (1 1/2 quart size). Sprinkle with sugar, spices and water. Cream butter, gradually add sugar. Blend in flour and oats. Spread over rhubarb. Bake in oven preheated to 375°F. (Moderately hot oven) for 35 to 40 minutes.
