HOLIDAY APPLE PUDDING 1 1/2 cups chopped apples 1/4 cup shortening (part butter) cup sifted Robin Hood Flour 3/4 teaspoon baking soda 1/4 teaspoon salt 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg 3/4 cup granulated sugar egg, beaten tablespoon cream Grease 6 to 8 individual moulds or custard cups. Quarter, core and peel apples (about 2 medium-sized). Chop finely and measure. Measure shortening and butter into mixing bowl and allow to stand to become soft. Sift together

flour, soda, salt, cinnamon and nutmeg. Cream shortening until fluffy,

gradually add sugar, mixing until creamy. Add beaten egg and beat well. Add dry ingredients and mix just until blended. Add prepared apples and cream, folding in lightly. Fill prepared moulds or custard cups half full. Bake in oven preheated to 350°F. (Moderate oven) for 30 minutes. Serve warm with Lemon Sauce, Brown Sugar Sauce, or Vanilla Sauce. Yield: - 6 to 8 servings. NOTE: For a more festive dessert, add 1/2 cup washed and dried raisins, 4 maraschino cherries, sliced, with chopped apple.
