

RECIPE OF THE WEEK FISH FILLET CRISPIES

2 lbs, fish fillets

1 teaspoon salt

4 teaspoon paprika

1½ cups soft breadcrumbs
1 teaspoon paultry dressing

1 tablespoon chopped parsley (optional)

1 teaspoon salt, pinch of pepper

2 tablespoons finely minced celery 1 tablespoon minced onion

1/4 cup milk

Use fillets of haddock or any other fish fresh or frozen. Cut in individual pieces, sprinkle with salt and paprika and place on greased baking dish. Mix breadcrumbs with remaining ingredients and place mounds of this dressing on each piece. A few slices of snipped bacon can be sprinkled on top of each piece or some grated cheese for added flavor, then bake the fish in a hot oven, 425 degrees F. for from 15 to 20 minutes, or allow 10 minutes per inch of thickness of fish. Do not overcook. Serve with wedges of lemon. Yields six servings.
