RECIPE OF THE WEEK

DEEP DISH APPLE PIE

6 cups thinly sliced apples
1 cup granulated sugar
 $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon cinnamon
 $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon nutmeg
1 teaspoon lemon juice
1 tablespoon butter

Prepare pastry and roll out top crust. Wipe, quarter, core, peel and slice apples, then measure. Combine sugar and spices. Add to apples and mix thoroughly. Turn into deep pie dish (10 x 6 x 2 inches). Sprinkle with lemon juice and dot with small pieces of butter. Cover with top crust. Place pie on lowest rack in oven preheated to 450° F. (Very hot oven). Bake for 10 Min. then reduce oven temperature to 350° F. (moderate oven) and bake for 30 minutes longer. To brown top of pie slightly, place pie higher in oven during last 15 min. of baking period. Serve with plain or whipped cream.

Note: If apples are dry, add 1 to 2 tablespoons water combined with the 1 teaspoon of lemon juice.
