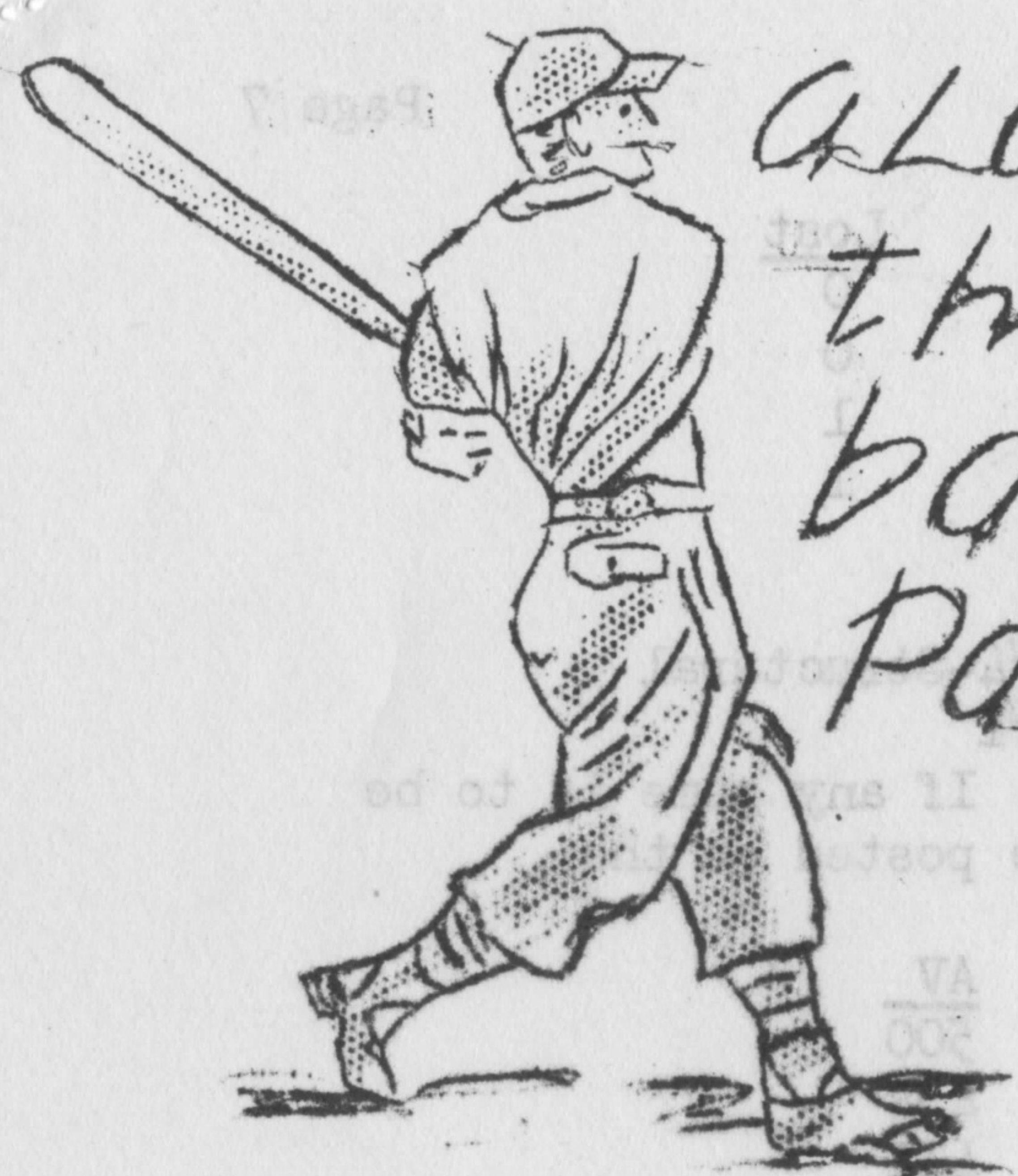
Alex Chisholm won the \$3.45 draw prize.
