HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

Following the previous notes, on the objects of the Scoieties, we have the Horticultural Societies Act: Inter-pretation

(a) "board" means borad of Directors elected under this Act.

(b) "Department" means Department of Agriculture

(c) "Minister" means Minister of Agriculture.

(d) "Society" means any Horticultural
Society organized under this
Act or under any former Act
having a similar purpose.

(e) "Superintendent" means Superintendent of Horticulture Societies.

The Minister may decide all matters of doubt or dispute arising in the operation or construction of this act and his decision shall be final.

An agreement in the form prescribed by the Minister shall be signed by the persons who desire to organize a Society and who are resident in the municipality in which the society is to be organized.

Every person who signs the agreement shall pay to person having charge thereof the sum of \$1.00 and all such sums shall become the property of the Scoiety upon its organization, and where no society is organized the sums shall be repaid to the persons entitled thereto.
