RECIPE OF THE WEEK CHESAPEAKE COLESLAW

2/3	cup ripe olives
4	cups shredded cabbage
1/4	cup shredded sweet green pepper
1/4	cup diced pimiento
1/2	cup thinly sliced celery
1	cup slivered luncheon meat
1/2	cup mayonnaise
1/4	cup table cream
1	teaspoon salt

Cut olives in large pieces. Combine with cabbage, green pepper, pimiento, celery and luncheon meat.

Blend mayonnaise, cream and salt. Pour over cabbage mixture and toss lightly.

Arrange in lettuce cups. Garnish with green pepper rings, whole ripe olives and additional slivers of meat, as desired.
