

TRACK AND FIELD RESULTS

Those of our hardier inhabitants who braved the chill and the odd shower last Friday saw some excellent competition at the annual track and field meet between the Schreiber and Terrace Bay Continuation schools.

You may remember, last week, that Terrace Bay felt quite confident of being able to win the Kiwanis Trophy this year. We apparently failed to take into consideration the equal confidence of Schreiber. In any case, when President Paul Boudreau of the Kiwanis club made the presentation at the party that evening, it was a Schreiber student who accepted the trophy.
