RECIPE OF THE WEEK
BUTTER TARTS

For one dozen tarts use:

- 1/3 cup butter
- 1/2 cup golden corn syrup
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 to 2/3 cup raisins
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 eggs

Line three-inch tart tins with pastry. Chill while making filling. Melt butter, add all ingredients except eggs. Mix thoroughly. Let mixture cool and add the eggs, beaten just sufficiently to combine yolks and whites. Pour filling into pastry-lined tart tins. Set on cookie sheet. Bake on lowest rack in very hot oven (450°F.) for 15 to 20 minutes. When baked, loosen edges with pointed knife. Allow to stand for at least 10 minutes before removing from tins.

NOTE: If syrupy filling is desired use 1 egg in place of 2 eggs in above recipe.
