

COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES

The second commencement exercises were held last Friday evening November 5th for a small audience of parents and friends of the Terrace Bay Continuation School.

Mr. E. Cavanaugh was the chairman for the evening. The program opened with the singing of "O Canada" followed by Mr. Cavanaugh introducing Mr. David Locking, the principal of the High School.
