MIXED LEAGUE

1. Composition of all rinks must be identical that is, a female lead, male second, female third, and male skip.
2. It is requested that each individual wishing to curl in the mixed league try to find a partner of the opposite sex. However, in the event a single person who wishes to curl does not locate a partner, a single application will be accepted. The draw committee will then attempt to match up all such single applicants.
3. Any couple may form a rink with any other couple of its choice. This provision is intended to ensure the utmost in congeniality.
4. Couples who do not form up into rinks on their own initiative will be assigned to rinks on the basis of chance. That is, their names will be drawn from a hat.
5. Each rink will decide for itself who will play the various positions, subject to rule 1 above.
6. Rules to govern substitution in the mixed league will be posted before the start of the first draw.
7. The rinks will be drawn to play a complete Round Robin.
8. As far as possible, all mixed league games will be drawn for Sunday afternoon.
9. Any person wishing to curl in the mixed league must be a paid-up member of either the Ladies' Club or the Men's Club prior to the start of the scheduled play.
