TERRACE BAY DEFEATS MARATHON 9 - 4

A packed house last Thursday December 30th saw the first league meeting of these arch rivals when approximately 200 Terrace Bay fans journeyed to Marathon to cheer their team on to victory by a nice 5-goal margin - a well earned win and one greatly appreciated by staunch Terrace supporters who have remained faithful through many close but heartbreaking games.
