RECIPE OF THE WEEK

GUMDROP COOKIES

- 1/2 cup shortening
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup sifted all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon soda
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- pinch salt
- 1/2 cup desiccated coconut
- 1/2 cup gumdrops (small)
- 1 cup oatmeal (quick-cooking)
- 1 egg, beaten

These cookies pack and travel well. Cream shortening and beat in white and brown sugar until creamy and light, add vanilla. Sift flour, soda, baking powder and salt. Take one-quarter cup of this mixture and sprinkle it over the coconut, gumdrops and oatmeal so that it is coated. Beat the sifted mixture into the creamed mixture in three parts, alternately with the beaten egg. Stir in the mixture of coconut, gumdrops and oatmeal. Pinch off small pieces of the dough and roll into one-inch balls. Flatten with the bottom of a small glass or a spatula, dipped in milk. Bake on greased cookie tins in a moderate oven 350 degrees F. for about 10 minutes. Yields about 3 dozen cookies.

HOUSEHOLD HINTS

Hooked rugs that have become faded can be revived by painting the faded parts with a strong solution of dye to match the original colorings. A small paint brush dipped in the hot dye and applied to the rug will give it new life.

Sew the front door key on to one end of a length of narrow elastic and sew or pin the other end on to the lining of your purse and you will notice how easy it is to find it.

White or simulated pearl costume jewellery is given a new lease on life if tinted any favorite shade by dipping it in and out of a dye solution. Make the solution double strength.

Tea or coffee stains in china cups or pitchers may be removed with a damp cloth dipped in baking soda.
