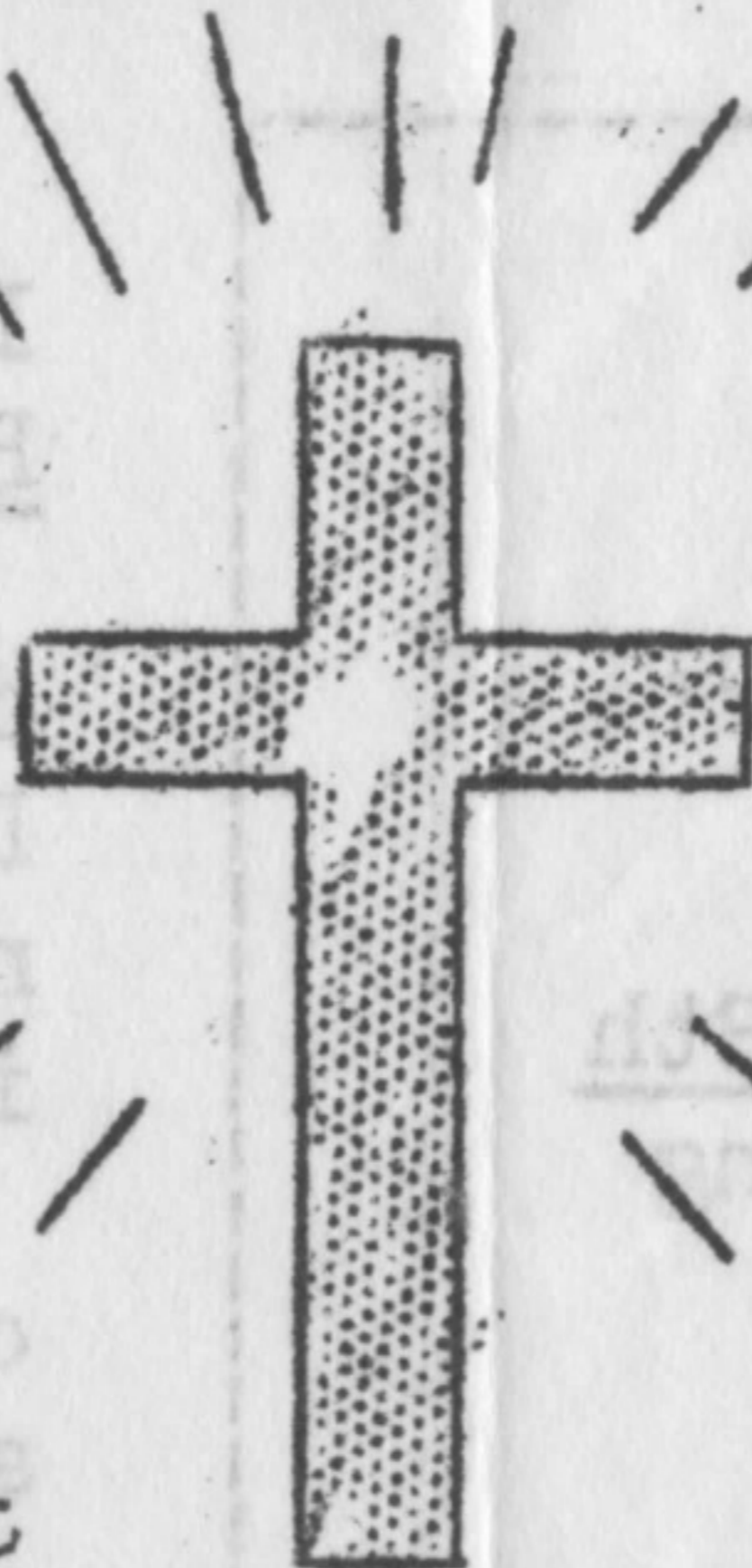
The program should prove to be interesting --- All members and friends are cordially invited to attend.
