RECIPE OF THE WEEK
GRIDDLE CAKES

cups sifted bread flour
tablespoons sugar
teaspoons baking powder
teaspoon salt
egg beaten slightly
cups milk
cups milk
tablespoons melted shortening
Preheat skillet to halfway between

medium and hot.

Sift flour, sugar, baking powder and salt into mixing bowl.

Combine egg, milk and shortening and add all at once to dry ingredients (for a thinner griddle cake add a little more liquid). Batter will be lumpy.

Grease skillet slightly. Drop
batter from spoon to desired size.
Turn as soon as bubbles begin to
burst on top.
Variation - Add 1/2 cup crisp cooked
bacon pieces or chopped cooked ham
