TERRACE BAY SUPERIORS HUMBLE NIPIGON FLYERS 5 TO 3

On Thursday evening at the Terrace Bay Arena the league leading Nipigon Flyers went down to defeat 5 to 3 before Doc Campbell's rejuvenated Superiors.

The local squad smarting from five straight defeats and fighting to get back in the running completely outclassed the highly touted Flyers.

The play was very fast throughout the entire game the first marker being registered just 38 seconds after the opening faceoff on a brilliant effort by Jim Moro and Cy Brassard who set up Osmar for the tally. At 13.13 Moro outsmarted the Flyer custodian on a well executed relay from defenceman Brassard. Only 3 minutes and 16 seconds had lapsed when Superiors "Dipsy Doodling Dandy" Marvin Osmar scored his second goal of the game with assists going to Moro and rear guard Jack Lang.

The final goal of the period came as a result of a goal mouth scrimmage with Tim Bond slapping the puck to Ray Stachiw who made no mistake in beating the bewildered Westerman. Stachiw performed spectacularly throughout the entire game on many occasions breaking up Nipigon attacks before they hit mid ice.

Nipigon registered their first goal just 28 seconds after the second period opened when Kotzma's slap shot dribbled between Frasers legs with Larry Dunville and Ahl drawing assists. At 29.35 Nipigon tallied once more with Ahl doing the honours with an assist to H. Manilla.
