POLIO VACCINE AVAILABLE THIS SPRING

Dr. M. McCausland, Medical Officer of Health today made the following announcement:

"It is hoped that polio vaccine may be made available this Spring for human vaccination. Owing to the fact that the supply of vaccine is limited, the Dept. of Health propose to restrict its use to children presently enrolled in the first and second grades of Elementary Schools, both Public and Separate. The vaccine will be supplied without cost.

It will be necessary that written consent for inoculation with the vaccine be secured from the respective parents or guardians.

It must be remembered that there should be no promises made as to the efficacy of the preparation."

The date and time of these inoculations will be announced in the Terrace Bay News.
