AUTO LICENSE DEALINE SET FOR FEBRUARY 28TH

A deadline of midnight February 28th for purchasing 1955 motor vehicle licenses and drivers' permits has been set by Highways Minister J. N. Allan. Officials of the Motor Vehicles Branch urge motorists to purchase their plates and licences before the annual last-minute rush. Some 230 outlets for purchasing licences operate in various parts of the Province, as well as the headquarters of the Branch at Parliament Buildings.

Last year a total of 1,487,210 vehicle licences were sold, of which 1,117,175 were for passenger cars. This year officials anticipate passenger vehicles will exceed 1,200,000 --- an all-time record.
