

RECIPE OF THE WEEK (Cont.) <u>Tuna Bake with Cheese Swirls</u> Knead dough a few times on lightly floured board. Roll into a rectangle about 1/4-inch thick. Sprinkle with cheese. Roll like a jelly roll, sealing edges. Cut in 1/2-inch slices, Place cut sides up and down on hot tuna mixture. Bake in a very hot oven of 450 deg. F. for 20 to 25 minutes.

2 cups (2 small cans) tuna fish, flaked

1 tablespoon lemon juice Cheese Biscuit Tupping:

1/2 cup ready-to-eat bran 3/4 cup milk

1-1/2 cups sifted bread flour 3 Teaspoons baking powder 1/2 teaspoon salt

1/3 cup shortening

2/3 cup grated cheddar cheese

Cook onions and pepper in heated butter about 3 minutes, Stir in flour and salt.

Slowly add broth and milk, stirring until thickened.

Sift flour, baking powder and salt into mixing bowl. Cut in shortening until mixture resembles coarse meal. Add soaked bran and stir only until combined to make a soft biscuit dough.
