BACON FRENCH TOAST

- 6 slices bacon
 1 egg slightly beaten
 1/2 cup milk
 1/8 teaspoon salt
 1 tablespoon fat
 3 slices bread
- Beat together in a deep bowl, the egg, milk and salt. Dip slices of bread in this mixture and brown on both sides in hot fat in a frying pan.

Meanwhile arrange bacon in a cold frying pan and cook over low heat until crisp, turning slices occasionally. Serve hot on top of French toast.
