



RECIPE OF THE WEEK
COCONUT FLAKE COOKIES

- 1-1/3 cups sifted flour
3 teaspoons double-acting baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
3 cups corn flakes or bran flakes
3/4 cup butter or other shortening
3/4 cup granulated sugar or brown sugar firmly packed
2 eggs
1 teaspoon vanilla
1-1/2 cups shredded coconut

Heat oven to moderate (375°F.)

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift again; add cereal flakes. Cream shortening, add sugar gradually, creaming thoroughly. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add vanilla. Then add the flour and cereal flakes mixture, a small amount at a time, beating after each addition. Add coconut. Drop from teaspoon on ungreased baking sheet and bake 12 to 15 minutes, or until done. Makes about 5 dozen delectable dainties.
