

RECIPE OF THE WEEK .

DATE MARGUERITES

2 egg whites
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 cup coarse graham cracker
crumbs
1 tsp. baking powder
1/4 tsp. salt
1 cup chopped pitted dates
cup chopped walnut meats

Beat egg whites stiff; add sugar gradually, beating constantly. Mix crumbs, baking powder and salt; fold into egg white mixture with dates, nut meats and vanilla extract. Spread in greased pan 8" x 8" x 2". Bake in moderate oven (350°F.) 35 minutes. Cool; cut in squares.
