MEN'S CHORUS PRESENTS SECOND ANNUAL CONCERT MAY 20TH

A year has passed, and the chorus is ready to present another concert. The Second Annual Concert will be presented Friday night in the High School Auditorium at 8:15 p.m. Tickets are 75¢ for adults and 35¢ for children, and may be obtained from chorus members or at the door.
