CORPORATION IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NEWS

The Board of Trustees of the Improvement District of Terrace Bay, at a special meeting held on Tuesday, May 17th, struck tax rates for the year 1955 as follows:

Public School	-	56.17 mills
Separate School	-	56.40 mills

These rates represent a decrease of 1.64 mills for the Public School and a decrease of 1.03 mills for the Separate School when compared with the corresponding rates for 1954.
