RECIPE OF THE WEEK

APPLE BETTY

- 3 cups soft bread crumbs
- 3 tbs. melted butter or margarine
- 3 tart apples (large)
- 1-1/2 tbs. lemon juice
- 1/2 tsp. grated lemon rind
- 3/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar
- 1/4 tsp. nutmeg
- 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
- 2/3 cup hot water

Toast crumbs; mix with butter or margarine. Place 1/3 crumbs in greased baking dish. Pare apples; core; slice thin. Arrange 1/2 apples on crumbs. Sprinkle with 1/2 juice and rind, sugar, nutmeg and cinnamon. Repeat, ending with crumbs. Add water bake in moderate oven (350 F.) 45 min. or until apples are tender. Serve hot with sauce.

SAUCE

- 1/3 cup butter or margarine
 - 1 cup confectioners' sugar
 - 1 tsp. vanilla extract
- Cream butter or margarine; add confectioners' sugar, creaming until fluffy. Add vanilla extract; mix well.
