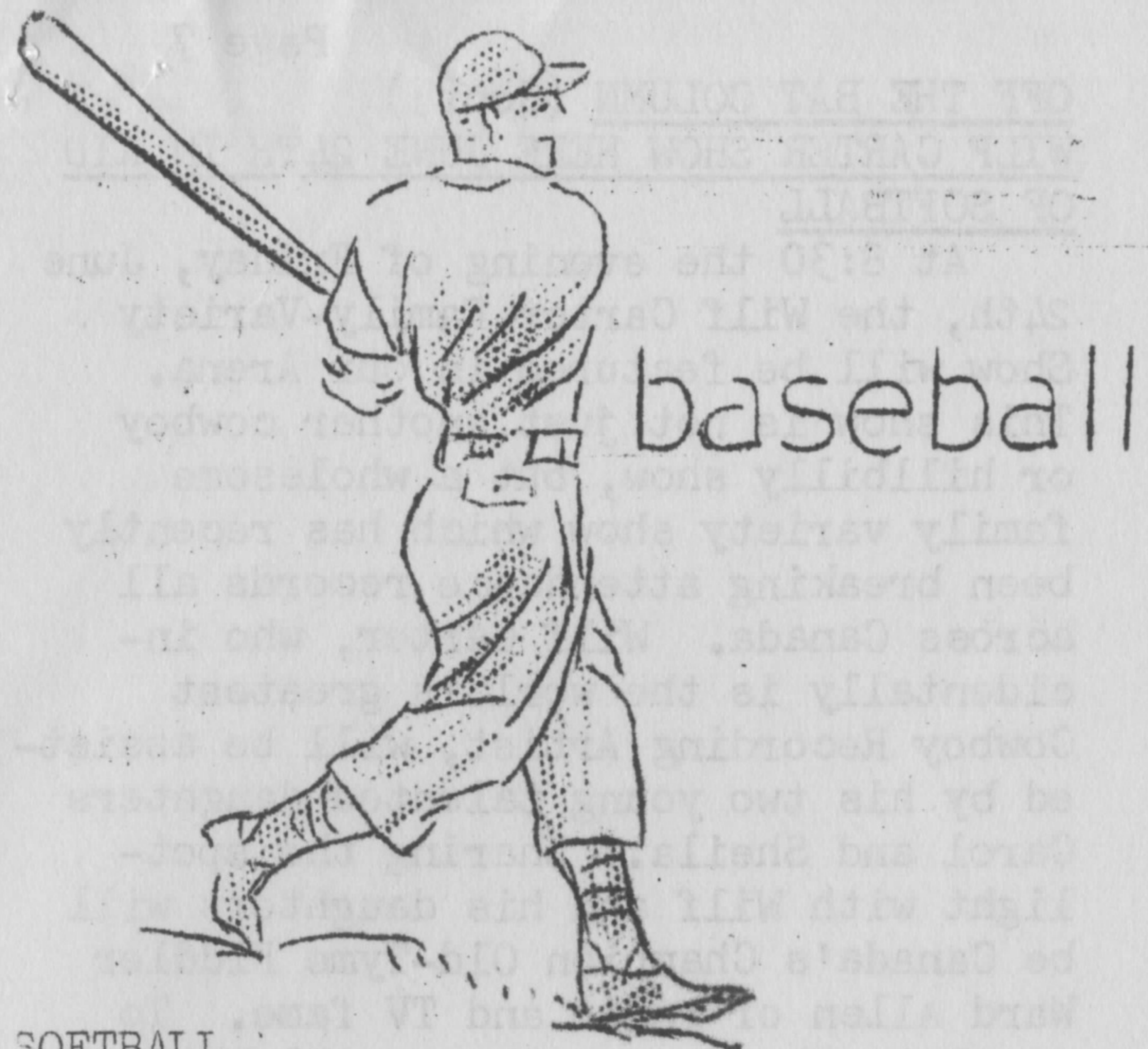


SOFTBALL (Cont.)
