



RECIPE OF THE WEEK

BLUEBERRY CRUNCH CAKE

- 1/3 cup shortening
 7/8 cup sugar
 1 egg, beaten light
 1/2 tsp. salt
 1/2 tsp. nutmeg
 1 cup blueberries
 2-1/2 cups sifted allpurpose flour
 4 tsps. baking powder
 1-1/4 cups milk.

Topping

- 3/4 tbsp. margarine (or butter)
 2 tbsps. sugar

Cream shortening with sugar; thoroughly mix in egg (beaten until light), nutmeg and salt. Set aside for moment.

Resift flour with baking powder. Into this mix the washed, thoroughly drained, dried berries. Fold resultant mixture, alternately with 1-1/4 cups milk, into creamed ingredients, prepared first and set aside.

Pour Batter into greased baking dish to depth of 1-1/2 inches. Top with 3/4 tablespoon butter (or margarine); sprinkle with 2 tablespoons sugar. Bake about 35 minutes--or until done---in moderately hot oven (375 deg. F.).

BE CAREFUL - WITH FIRE

Build campfires only on rock, sand, gravel or mineral soil, near water, advises the Ont. Dept. of Lands and Forests. Clear away all inflammable debris and overhanging branches. Keep the fire small; it will give enough heat.

When you leave your campfire, even for a few minutes, put it dead out, with water. Before you move on, pour more water around the edges and make sure no live coals remain in the ashes.

Never smoke while walking or working in the bush or on the trail. Be good woodsmen---sit down to smoke.
