RECIPE OF THE WEEK STRAWBERRY PUFF

2 tbs. sugar
 1 tbs. cornstarch
 Few grains salt
 2 eggs
 1 cup milk
 1 cup whipping cream
 1/2 tsp. vanilla extract
 1/4 tsp. almond extract
 12 lady fingers
 Preserved strawberries

Mix sugar, cornstarch and salt,
 Beat eggs; add with milk. Cook over
 hot water, stirring constantly,
 until mixture thickens and coats spoon.
 Chill. Whip cream; fold in. Add vanilla
 and almond extracts. Split lady fingers;
 halve. Arrange in sherbet glasses; top
 with cream mixture. Garnish with straw-
 berries.
