A WORD TO ALL PARENTS

A section of our 36 inch water line which runs under the C.P.R. main tracks east of the station is being replaced. Involved is a lot of excavating. Some of the holes are 10 to 15 feet deep. And in the area, ground water occurs at as little as 6 feet below surface. A combination of rock flow and the water creates a very dangerous condition not at all unlike quicksand. Children found playing nearby are being warned of the danger. This appeal is directed to parents who are urged to keep children away from the construction area because of the extreme hazard.
