SOME INTERESTING COMPARISONS 1954-55  
From the Canadian Statistical Review

Total labour income during April showed an advance of nearly 6% over April 1954. The average hourly earnings in the manufacturing industries were 145.4 in May 2-1/2% over a year ago. Output of Electrical Power rose to 6,640 million kilowatt hours in May nearly 12% increase.

Producers Shipments of Crude Petroleum totalled 9,532,000 barrels in March, 1955, over 50% above the corresponding month a year ago. Revenue freight car loadings on Canadian railways totalled 375,600 in June a gain of 15% over the previous June. Woodpulp (Mechanical and Chemical) 823,700 tons in April 1955 as compared with 786,800 tons in April 1954.

The consumers price index (Formerly cost of living index) stood at 116.0 in July 1955 two-tenths of a point.
