

CARAMEL DIVINITY CAKE cup shortening 3/4 cup sugar cups cake flour 1-1/2 tsp. baking powder

1/4 tsp. salt 1/2 cup milk 3/4 tsp. almond extract

egg whites

Cream together shortening and sugar. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Add alternately with milk to creamed mixture. Add almond extract Beat egg whites stiff; fold in. Pour into 2 greased 8" layer pans. Bake in moderately hot oven (375°F.) 25 min. Cool 5 min. Remove layers from pans; cool on wire rack.

Prepare Caramel Frosting; spread between layers and on top of cake.

CARAMEL FROSTING

1b. (2-1/4 cups) firmly packed brown sugar

cup milk

cup butter margarine Few grains salt

tsp. vanilla extract

Combine sugar, milk, butter or

margarine and salt. Bring to boiling. Boil, stirring constantly, to 234 F.

(or when small quantity dropped into cold water forms soft ball). Remove from heat; cool to lukewarm (110°F.). Add vanilla extract. Beat until creamy and of right consistency for spreading. Makes enough to fill and frost 3 9" cake layers or frost 19" tube cake.
