NATIONAL IMMUNIZATION WEEK SEPTEMBER 25 TO OCTOBER 1, 1955.

The importance of immunizing children against disease is stressed in a message from Governor-General Vincent Massey in connection with national immunization week, starting September 25th.

Issued from his temporary residence at the citidel here, the message is as follows:

September 25th to October 1st has been declared "National Immunization Week" and during this time the Health League of Canada, in cooperation with all the departments of health, will try to bring home to Canadian parents the necessity of pro-

tecting their children by immunization against disease.

Diphtheria and whooping cough still take their toll of young Canadians, and although small pox is practically non-existent in Canada today, even it may re-occur without the protection of immunization.

Canada offers splendid opportunities to its young people. Let us do all that we can, by early and regular immunization, to see that our children do not suffer through ignorance or neglect, and that they can participate to the full in the great future of our country.
