SAVING BOND SALE UNDERWAY

On October 17th the Campaign for

Savings Bond began.

As of Wednesday October 19th with just a few of the canvassers reporting there have been ten thousand dollars worth of bonds sold. So it looks like the campaign is off to a good start.

Any refusals the canvassers have had in some cases is because the people have tied up their money in some other long range program. However these Bonds are a good way to save for a long or short term need. So don't forget those holidays next summer, or next winter's fuel bill. A fifty or a hundred dollar bond can come in mighty handy.

Here are a few facts on the 10th

Series Canada Savings Bonds -

1. 3-1/1%-- and this interest is paid on November 1st, 1956 and on November 1st each year thereafter for a total of 12 years.

2. 10th Series Canada Savings Bonds mature November 1st 1967, but you can cash them at full face value -- not a penny less -- plus earned interest at any time at any bank in Canada. On redemption interest is paid at the rate of 3-1/4 per (Cont. on next col.)

SAVING BOND SALE UNDERWAY (Cont.) cent per annum for each calendar month the bond is held.

3. Bonds are registered in an individual's name and this registration gives protection in the event your bond is lost, stolen or destroyed.

4. There is no delay in redeeming your bond and no service charge of any kind. Simply complete the redemption form on the bond and present it to your Bank and receive your cash immediately.
