FIRE PREVENTION WEEK OCTOBER 9TH-15TH, 1955.

Fire Prevention week commemorates the greatest fire in the continent's history -- The Chicago Fire of October 9th, 1871. This fire had a simple origin when Mrs. O'Leary's cow kicked over a lighted lantern. Before the fire had been extinguished property valued at \$170,000,000 had been destroyed, 500 lives lost, and thousands of families left homeless.

The losses suffered by owners and tenants of property is only a part of the cost of fires to those immediately concerned. For many cases - loss of income - unemployment - human suffering - or tragedies are experienced. It is a matter of record that 43% of fire-gutted plants never resume operation. The blotting-out of our industry affects practically every business, loss of payroll, and relocation of employees for other employment.

Few people realize that everyone shares the cost of fire, in increased living costs, higher rentals, insurance rates and taxes.

It is thus a matter of concern to all that fire prevention is practiced every day in Terrace Bay. Our fire losses are very low -- let's keep them that way in 1956.

The fire alarm was again sounded at St. Martin's Separate School at 2:10 p.m. the school was emptied in 36 seconds. Miss Hunt's class, grades 3 and 4 were declared the winners and a silk Union Jack flag was presented them by Fire Chief Maitland.

The Drill

(1) Pupils take their places in the school yard with the teacher standing at the head of the class.

(2) The teacher standing at the head of the class can count the pupils and see that none are missing or break line or get in the way of the firemen or equipment.

The fire department considers that the fire drills were very well done and it speaks well for the Principals, their staffs and the pupils.
