Beat eggs; add sugar. Cook over hot water stirring constantly, 15 min. Add rind; cool. Add corn flakes. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt; add. Add nut meats; mix well. Spread in greasedpan 8" x 8" x 2". Bake in moderate oven (350 F.) 20 min. Cocl; cut in bars.
